## **Projects in Delivery**

- Some projects due a mid-term review. Includes year 4 and year 5 projects.
- 45.6km forecast for year 4.

## **Projects in Development**

- Approvals likely in the new year for projects in development 11 in total.
- NW expects to gather more opportunities through new Bluespaces Delivery Managers engagement has been reduced due to staff changes recently.
- PR commented that Natural Flood Management projects in ESW may be opportunities for the programme.

## **Project Approvals**

Wansbeck Riparian Corridor Improvements

- External project (no NW linked improvements)
- 4.7km of improvements
- Invasive species removal, woodland improvement, fish passage, improve balance between biodiversity and recreation, new eel pass
- Match funding of £10,760 required by Bluespaces
- Match funding also provided by EA and Parish Council
- Priority area from customer research undertaken to support Bluespaces
- Groundwork NE partner worked with previously

ML – How certain is the unknown match funding? [ST- EA WEIF money is already in place]. Eel pass is complex. Recommends early engagement with EA around design.

GD – ongoing maintenance of new structures should be considered. [ST- Legacy is being addressed by wider project. Council will take on responsibility of maintenance of infrastructure e.g. paths after project.]

RP – Invasive species extent query. Discussion on invasive species control across regions. RSPB Flatford Mill – worth speaking to about HB control (Mark Nowers).

RP - Unsure whether Water Forum may continue. Question asked over the WEGG and its future: NW would like the WEGG to continue in some form regardless of the PR24 plans, as the internal company measure will remain linked to the pledge to improve 500 km bluespaces, and the group provides external assurance and support for the approach. A review of the group structure and terms of reference is likely to be needed.

NE Catchments Hub – this new collaboration was presented to the group (see slides), enabled by a strategic partnership between NW and The Rivers Trust, and which Anna Gerring manages. Very positive comments were received from members all-round for this new approach.
